## Gujarat HC seeks traffic police's reply over collection of Aadhaar, PAN cards from auto drivers



**AHMEDABAD:** The Gujarat High Court on Thursday issued notice to the Ahmedabad city's joint commissioner of traffic seeking his response over a petition filed by an auto-rickshaw drivers' union objecting to the traffic police's drive to gather personal details of professional drivers, including their Aadhaar and PAN cards.

Justice V D Nanavati has sought reply from the top cop

exception to the collection of documents from auto drivers under the name of Nirbhaya Safe City Project. It has termed the police action "arbitrary, malicious, illegal and misuse of power".

The petitioner has contended that the traffic police have got ample power to check the documents of a vehicle, driving license and identity of the driver under the Motor Vehicles Act and under the rules framed by the Centre and the state government. However, the police do not have any power to collect Aadhaar cards, PAN cards and that too by threatening the auto drivers if they do not supply documents, their vehicles would be detained, the petition alleged.

Another objection against the police's data collection drive is on the ground that only auto drivers are subjected to the programme.



**AHMEDABAD:** In the heart of Gujarat's wilderness, a striking imbalance within the Asiatic lion population has captured the attention of researchers and conservationists.

While everywhere else in the state, the ratio is one lion to two lionesses, Bhavnagar mainland and coastal region have two for every lioness.

A research paper titled 'Population status and distribution of endangered Asiatic lions in Gujarat, India', authored by Mohan Ram, Dushyant Vasavada, Shyamal Tikadar, Lahar Jhale, and Yashpal Zala highlights this skewed ratio. The study indicates that while the entire lion landscape maintains an adult male-to-adult female ratio of 1:1.61, Bhavnagar mainland and coastal region populations exhibit a skewed sex ratio of 1:0.5 (adult males to adult females). This imbalance is attributed to the dispersal of males from protected areas to new territories.

The research reveals that the Mitiyala Wildlife Sanctuary exhibits the highest adult male-to-adult female ratio of 1:3.5. This is likely due to the sanctuary's smaller population of only 16 lions and lionesses within an 18.22 sq km forest patch.

The study suggests that older or territorial males, displaced for various reasons, might seek refuge in habitat patches of Greater Gir, leading to skewed sex ratios in these two satellite populations. The study further details that the adult female-to-cub ratio varies, ranging from 1:0.3 in the Mitiyala population to 1:1.3 in the Bhavnagar coast population. Earlier studies had shown lower lion densities in

Girnar Wildlife Sanctuary compared to Gir protected areas. However, the present study indicates that lion densities in both protected areas are now equal, suggesting an increase in the lion population in Girnar sanctuary over time.

In 2020, the overall population density of Asiatic lions in their landscape was estimated to be 3.03 lions per 100 sq km. The population density of Asiatic lions in non-forested areas is 1.65 lions per 100 sq km. In comparison, it is 15.20 lions per 100 sq km in national parks, wildlife sanctuaries, reserved forests, protected forests, and unclassified forests.

The highest lion density was observed in Gir-Somnath at 5.75 lions per 100 sq km, followed by Junagadh (3.30 lions/100 sq km), Amreli (3.28 lions/100 sq km), and Bhavnagar (1.23 lions/100 sq km).

An expert from the Wildlife Institute of India (WII) expressed concerns about the declining male-to-female ratio, highlighting that the ratio was 1.67 females per male in 2010, increasing to 1.84 females per male in 2015, and decreasing to 1.61 females per male in 2020.

H Singh, a lion expert and former Gujarat forest officer, emphasized that a ratio of over 1.5 females per male is healthy for big cats. He noted, "Nomadic males often face risks such as train accidents, electrocution, or poisoning when they leave the group."



**AHMEDABAD:** It is common to see pedestrians jump into busy traffic, bound over dividers, dodge cars and leap to the safety of the opposite pavement. This is not because of some subliminal death wish, but because 72% of Ahmedabad's streets don't have footpaths.

This was revealed at the civic body's general board meeting on Wednesday by leader of the opposition Shahzad Khan Pathan. "Of the road network of 2,634km in the city, only 731km has footpaths. The rest is occupied by cycle stands, vendors or nothing at all," said Pathan.

He cited a Union ministry of road transport and highways report which stated that in 2020 and 2021, 744 people died in accidents in the city, of whom 25% were pedestrians and 43% were two-wheeler riders.

"Why do these pedestrians die? Because the Ahmedabad Municipal Corporation (AMC) has no policy for development of footpaths. They are of different widths and materials and some are older than the roads," said Pathan. Ashram Road has a 6m footpath along a service road, while Sindhu Bhavan Road and CG Road have 3m footpaths. On every road, footpaths are made using materials - tiles,

concrete or bricks. Pathan pointed out that

"Instead, it has allowed roundabouts of arbitrary width. Accidents are inevitable when you don't know which lane to use or where to turn," Pathan said.

## 6.55cr Aadhaar card holders in state: Union govt

Ahmedabad: In reply to a question in the Lok Sabha on Wednesday, the Union government said there are 6.55 crore Aadhaar card holders in Gujarat, while the number for India stands at 130.20 crore. Gujarat MP Vinod Chavda sought to know the number of citizens in Gujarat for whom Aadhaar numbers are yet to be issued.

In a written reply, Union minister of state for electronics and information technology Rajevee Chandrasekar said, "As on June 30, 2023, after adjusting for the estimated number of deaths, the estimated number of living Aadhaar number holders is 130.20 crore across India, including 6.55 crore in the state of Gujarat." As of June 30, Ahmedabad district, with 78.03 lakh Aadhaar cards, has the highest number of Aadhaar card holders in the state, while Botad district has the fewest at 2.35 lakh.

## Woman stalked online, one held

**Rajkot:** The Halvad police in Morbi district arrested a 24-year-old man for sending vulgar messages to a woman relative by creating her fake profile on Instagram. The accused Mahesh Vighani (24) was arrested after the woman lodged the complaint against him on Monday. According to the police, Vighani was in one-sided love with the woman. When she got engaged, Vighani misused her social media platforms in a bid to break her engagement.

**Rajkot:** Vice-president of Mangrol taluka panchayat, his father and brother were booked under the Atrocities Act for allegedly hurling casteist slurs at an employee and thrashing him. The victim Vanraj Gohel lodged a complaint against Atif Rafai, his father Bapusa, and his elder brother Razzak. He alleged that the accused had assigned him some work in the office. However, as he was tied up with other things, he asked them to wait. The accused got enraged and hurled casteist abuses at him.

## Police van driver's death: IPS officer, PI summoned



Ahmedabad: Furious over police inaction after the suspected murder of a police van driver in Junagadh, the Gujarat High Court on Thursday ordered IPS officer Ravi Teja and police inspector M M Vadher to remain present in the court on Friday.

Justice Samir Dave questioned as to why Junagadh police did not conduct investigation and instead carried out only an inquiry into an apparent case of murder for five months.

He questioned the reason behind not lodging an FIR in a case in which a police van driver, Brijeshbhai Lavadiya, was found hanging from a tree in March during four hours at the Police Training College in March. His son has filed a petition demanding action in his father's death.

The court had summoned the SP and the police inspector, but they informed the court that they were transferred to Junagadh four days ago and hence were not well-versed with the case details. This led Justice Dave to summon IPS officer Ravi Teja, who was an SP of Junagadh district when the incident had taken place, and inspector Vadher.

While summoning the officials, Justice Dave said, "The allegations have been made against a DYP level officer. Who will investigate the case then? An FIR has not been registered and merely an inquiry is going on for five months. You don't take action in a case of murder, and merely an inquiry is going on over a case of Section 302 of IPC?" The court has sought a report from the newly transferred cop by August 18.

## Air fares soar, hotels full as I-Day weekend nears

**AHMEDABAD:** A quick monsoon escapade over the extended weekend of August 12-13 will cost at least 50% higher than usual as hotels are nearly full and air fares to domestic and international destinations have skyrocketed. Many hotels are witnessing a double-digit increase in booking inquiries.

"There is a significant increase in customers opting for luxury and upscale accommodations during this period. Despite the skyrocketing air fares, there is a marked rise in last-minute bookings for destinations like Mount Abu, Jaipur, Kumbhalgarh, Jodhpur, Jaisalmer, Jaipur and even Khandala and Lonavala," said Manish Sharma, chairman, Tourism Development Society. International bookings are also high, especially to destinations like Dubai, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Vietnam and Phuket. "Better flight connectivity means that more people are travelling abroad for a quick break this season," said another Ahmedabad-based travel operator. City-based professional Deboshri Das is taking a road trip to Goa with her husband and her pet, Mojo. "We try to travel with Mojo at least once a year. Since the weather has cooled down, we are looking forward to trips to nearby destinations," said Das. Ambawadi resident Janki Rathod is headed to Dehradun to take in the serenity of the lush mountains. "This year, the season is buzzing. Many hotel bookings were made in June itself and overall, tariffs in hotels across popular nearby destinations have increased by 25-30%. In wake of the high air fares, which have grown by nearly 50%, many travellers are opting for road trips to nearby destinations," said Virendra Shah, chairman, Travel Agents Association of India (TAAI).

## Beware! Dodgy digital deals can get your bank account frozen



**AHMEDABAD:** Picture this: You're enjoying a delightful family lunch at a local restaurant, ready to settle the bill using the unified payment interface (UPI), only to find yourself frozen bank accounts and police investigations. Pratishtha Shah, 52, found herself in this situation after her UPI transaction declined. A call to her husband revealed that her UPI account had been implicated in an online fraud case, a consequence of her teenage son's occasional use of the account to purchase bitcoins. As the day unfolded, she received more shocking news: Along with her account, the police also froze the bank accounts of her father-in-law to whom she had transferred money, the provision store she shopped at, and the gymnasium where she paid the membership fee online.

This unsettling experience isn't a work of fiction. It's a stark reminder of the real and increasing threat of cybercrime. In a world where digital transactions have become routine, the popular UPI payment system and peer-to-peer (P) platforms for bitcoin trading offer convenience in paying money to acquaintances and strangers. However, it could also put you in the crosshairs of the police and the banks.

In financial fraud cases, scammers often transfer money to separate bank accounts, buy products or invest in various services. Subsequently, when police receive a complaint, they quickly ask banks to freeze the accounts to which the swindled money has been

diverted. Apart from UPI payments, the police also freeze accounts that received deposits through NEFT, RTGS, and cheques. To prevent further diversion of the swindled money, all accounts linked to the one in which the money arrived or was sent are also frozen.

Every day, about 355 to 477 people are coned by cybercriminals in Gujarat. In just one week, the police froze the bank accounts of 1,065 to 1,431 individuals. Explaining the intricate web of cybercrimes, DYP of Gujarat CID's cyber cell, B M Tank, details how cybercriminals employ multiple bank accounts to obscure their money trail after swindling victims. The stolen money undergoes a labyrinthine journey, passing through layers of accounts before being withdrawn from ATMs or converted into bitcoins, he says, adding: "To trace this complex trail,

investigators often have to navigate up to 8 levels of accounts beyond the fraudster's initial account." CID (crime) inspector Pankaj Patel, who oversees the 1930 cyber cell helpline, emphasizes that freezing bank accounts pre-emptively is the primary strategy to thwart cybercriminals.

He advises individuals to exercise caution when accepting financial connections on UPI and similar platforms. "Such transactions involve risk because a link is formed between your account and theirs. So, if they do anything wrong, it might create problems for you," he warns. Tank's guidance is crystal clear: Refrain from using your primary salary account for bitcoin transactions or linking it to your UPI. He says, "Maintain some funds in an alternative bank account to avoid problems in case your account gets frozen."

## Weather stations set up in AIJ, PDEU

Ahmedabad: As part of a new research initiative to map air quality and other parameters of weather, the Bronx Community College University (PDEU), Five more higher educational institutions in western India are part of the initiative. "The solar-powered weather sensor will monitor temperature, humidity, wind speed and direction, rainfall, UV radiation, solar radiation and air quality. The air quality device will monitor PM 2.5 and Air Quality Index (AQI). It will

help carry out research on climate and impact of various factors such as vehicular pollution and air direction on ambient air quality," said a PDEU official. Ahmedabad University officials said that Neal Phillip and Parmita Sen, part of City University of New York Remote Sensing Earth Systems Institute (CUNY CREST), are the co-principal investigators in the research. "The new weather station aligns with the work at AIJ's Air and Climate Research Laboratory that regularly monitors ambient air quality. One of the focus areas of the lab is on the usage of small, low-cost atmospheric sensor modules for investigating particulate matter," said an Ahmedabad University official.
